Special Guest Speaker at Bible Brunch Buddies

The Rev. Dr. Pam Durso, Executive Director of Baptist Women in Ministry Wednesday, October 18th 12:00 pm

"The Silenced and Muffled Voices of the Reformation"

The voices of Martin Luther and John Calvin were loud and bold as they called for reform in the sixteenth century. There are familiar and well-known voices, but the words of women and laymen who spoke out, participated, and work for reform during those same years have too long been silenced or muffled. Join us in a discussion of the writings, contributions, and leadership of these lesser-known reformers, who helped reshape the Christian world.



Pam Durso is executive director of Baptist Women in Ministry, where she is an advocate and a resource for women serving in all areas of Christian ministry. She assumed the role of executive director on July 1, 2009, after serving as a volunteer on the BWIM's Leadership Team for four years. Previously, Pam worked as associate executive director-treasurer of the Baptist History and Heritage Society and served on the faculty of Campbell University Divinity School as assistant professor of church history and Baptist heritage. She currently serves as adjunct faculty at McAfee School of Theology in Atlanta.

Since receiving her Ph.D. in church history from Baylor University in 1992, Pam has been a strong supporter of clergywomen and has written and edited numerous articles and books on women. She co-edited with LeAnn Gunter Johns, *The World is Waiting for You: Celebrating the 50th Ordination Anniversary of Addie Davis* (2014). She also edited and contributed to *This Is What A Preacher Looks Like: Sermons by Baptist Women in Ministry* (2010), wrote five State of Women in Baptist Life reports (2005, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2015). Her other books include *On Mission with God: Free and Faithful Baptists in the Twenty-*

First Century (2011), The Story of Baptists in the United States (2006), which she co-wrote with her husband, Keith Durso, and Courage and Hope: The Stories of Ten Baptist Women Ministers (2005), which she and Keith co-edited. Her most recent book is We Proceed On: The History of Pintlala Baptist Church (2016). Her first book was based on her dissertation, The Power of Women: The Life and Writings of Sarah Moore Grimke (2004). Keith and Pam have two college-age children, Michael, and Alexandra.

So thank you . . . for the looking time.


You keep us loving,
